## **Instruction**

### **One-to-One Device Program**

The focus of the 1:1 device program in the Scotland Public School District is to provide one of the necessary tools and resources for a progressive learning environment characterized by flexibility, collaboration, personalization, creativity, and technology-rich learning. In the Scotland Public School District, technology will be integrated throughout the educational program in a seamless and timely fashion. The 1:1 device setting empowers students and teachers to use technology like adults do in the real world, accessing and using purposeful technology-based tools anytime a task calls for them.

The Scotland Board of Education believes learning is a continuous dynamic interaction among students, educators, parents, and the extended community. Implementation of a 1:1 device initiative enables anywhere, anytime learning that is no longer limited by the four walls of a classroom or building. Purposeful technology integration affords teachers the opportunity to not only deliver content but also be facilitators of individualized learning for all students.

1:1 devices will be issued each fall to incoming students in grades 1 to 6. The 1:1 devices are to be used only in the school building. Parents and students must sign and return the **Scotland Elementary School One-to-One Device Agreement Grades 1-6** document before a 1:1 device will be issued to a student. For each school year, the cost for the school district to replace a One-to-One device will be published in the Scotland Elementary School One-to-One Device Agreement Grades 1-6 along with the cost of the device license. By signing the Scotland Elementary School One-to-One Device Agreement Grades 1-6 document the student agrees to follow and accept the One-to-One device guidelines and the parent acknowledges the financial responsibility for the school replacement of the One-to-One device. If, for whatever reason, a parent does not pay the replacement cost for a damaged One-to-One device, the student will not be issued a replacement One-to-One device.
